Call to Order

Chairman Mike Chamness called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone attending.

Minutes

Chairman Chamness called the following motion:

- *Motion to approve the minutes from the February 27, 2019, Council of Chairs Meeting.*

Chairman Chamness announced that after meeting with representatives from the Illinois Criminal Justice Authority (ICJA), it was determined that ICJA would become a member of the Public Health Committee and no longer be a member of the Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Committee.

Old Business

Status update on projects using the unallocated SFY 19 Preparedness and Response (PAR) Grant Program funds.

Chairman Chamness and Bob Evans, Preparedness Grants Section Manager, discussed the \$2.5m in unallocated funds from the SFY 19 Unmet Needs Preparedness and Response (PAR) Grant Program (funds expire June 30, 2019). All Committee Chairs, including the City of Chicago Office of Emergency Management and Communication (OEMC) and Cook County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM), reported that all projects are on track except for the following projects (see attached spreadsheet). Also, Chairman Chamness reported that the Operational Response funds will be retained until early June. If not needed, the funds will be reallocated.

- *Motion from ILEAS to recommend to the full ITTF membership that \$27,086.85 be reallocated in the 19ILEASPAR from one equipment line to another equipment line. The bomb suits (four to local and one to SOS) were less expensive than expected. The three equipment two vehicles purchased for the Mobile Field Force teams were also less expensive than expected. The \$27K will be used to purchase more hazmat LION suits for all the Special Response Teams.*

- *Motion to recommend to the full ITTF membership the revised spending plan for unallocated SFY 19 Preparedness and Response (PAR) Grant Funds to include: a \$30,000 increase to ISP SWMDT Operational Response; a \$60,000 increase for IFSI Prop-Equipment; and \$54,000 increase for ILEAS to purchase additional Stop the Bleed Kits or prop work at IFSI.*

Status update on the projects using the reallocation of FFY 16 state-retained UASI funds.

As discussed at the February 27, 2018, ITTF Chairs meeting, Cook County DHSEM and City of Chicago OEMC discussed the need to determine alternate prioritization projects from the FFY 16 UASI (\$1.26m) funds due to procurement delays. (See attached spreadsheet).

- *Motion to recommend to the full ITTF membership a revised spending plan in the amount of \$1.264m from the state-retained FFY 16 UASI funds.*

New Business

Discussion of the additional reallocation of funds for FFY 16 SHSGP in the amount of \$200,000 and state-retained FFY 16 UASI funds in the amount of \$140,000

- *Motion to recommend to the full ITTF membership the revised spending plan in the amount of \$140,000 from the FFY 16 UASI funds. To include; \$63,593.18 - CPIC Fusion Center IT Refresh; \$66,300 - Thermal Imaging Cameras; and \$10,106.82 to cover remainder of overage from the above FF 16 projects (spreadsheet attached).*

Bob Evans reported the Tactical Interoperable Communications Plan (TICP) Planner/Contractor position that was allocated to IEMA in the amount of \$75,000 (discussed and approved at the December 12, 2018, ITTF full membership meeting) has not been filled. He anticipates there will be an additional \$40,000 available for reallocation. Discussion followed. It was determined that a motion would be made at the full membership meeting to grant the authority to the Council of Chairs to determine projects to be funded with the reallocation at the May Chairs meeting.

Vice-chair Page of the Law Enforcement Committee Mutual Aid Committee reported a request was received from the Illinois School and Campus Safety Program Manager, Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute (ILETSB)/Western Illinois University (WIU) for additional funds to provide additional (11) training sessions for K-12 schools. The trainings will be scheduled and completed prior to July 31, 2019.

- *Motion to recommend to the full ITTF membership to allocate \$42,000 from the FFY16 SHSGP reallocation funds to Western Illinois University (WIU) School Safety Training Grant.*

- Motion from ILEAS to recommend to the full ITTF membership to allocate \$120,000 from the FFY16 SHSGP reallocation funds to the 16ILEACOM2.
 - These funds will be used in conjunction with the current ILEAS 17ILEASSRT grant to continue the capital replacement process as outlined in the Unmet Needs Report. Three WMD Special Response Teams have replaced their 14-year-old radios. These funds will replace two more teams' radios. One additional team will need to have their radios replaced.

- These funds will be invested in 19 portable scene lighting units, replacing old lights for each Mobile Field Force team and adding one for each EOD team (19 total units - \$29,620). And to purchase Stop the Bleed kits (226 kits - \$8,380.00) for special teams' response vehicles (UCP, ITECS, EMAT Command Trailer, IMT Team, other special teams, etc.)

Federal 17 SHSGP Current ILEAS Grants

- *Motion from ILEAS to recommend to the full ITTF membership to make inter- and intra-grant line item transfers as depicted in the attached spreadsheet.*
 - Due to some budget line items not being spent or items coming in less than budgeted, the following surpluses were identified:
 - Special Teams Overtime/Backfill (OT/BF) – the reduction of teams and a decrease in requests for OT/BF resulted in a surplus in the budgeted amount.
 - Because the State of Illinois closes down the processing of new fiscal year invoice reimbursements from July 1 through November, combined with its practice of taking 5-6 months to reimburse PAR grants, there are large portions of the year during which validation and other exercises cannot occur, training does not take place and purchases are delayed until later in the year, resulting in surpluses.
 - Equipment comes in at a cost less than anticipated through the RFP/Bid process.
 - Lag time between staff resignations and filling positions.

Chief Aaron Kustermann, ISP, reported that due to lack of hiring STIC analysts, ISP STIC is requesting approval to extend the FFY 17 ISP STIC grant to June 30, 2020, and to reprogram \$235,000 to digital audio/visual upgrades for STIC Watch Center and Public Safety Section. The extension is needed to complete the upgrades. Discussion followed.

- *Motion from ISP STIC to the full ITTF membership to extend the FFY 17 ISP STIC grant to June 30, 2020, working with the state administrative agency, and to reallocate the FFY 17 ISP STIC analysts' salaries up to \$235,000 to be used for digital audio/visual upgrades for STIC.*

Chairman Chamness discussed the following timeline:

- April 15 through May 2 - Committees meet to discuss strategy, projects, funding, and SHSP/UASI split
- May 3 - ITTF Chairs meeting (starting at 10:00 a.m.)
 - Chairs to discuss State strategy, projects, and initial budget
- May 16 - Organizations submit initial Attachment As with SHSP/UASI split and justification for split. Also, a personnel list for organizations who have positions listed for funding on the Attachment A.
- May 22 -ITTF Chairs meeting (starting at 10:00 a.m.)
 - Chairs to discuss Attachment A project submissions, overall SHSP/UASI split, state/local split, and any other relevant FFY 19 discussions.
- June (TBD)-ITTF Chairs and Full meetings to vote on FFY 19 HSGP submission to FEMA.
- August 1 - Organizations submit Final Attachment As.
- September - IEMA receives FFY 19 Award and begins to issue grant agreements.

Other Business

Colonel Royal Mortenson, IFSI, discussed a multifaceted all-hazard exercise that improves integration and interoperability of Illinois and federal response capabilities to be held at IFSI and Chicago on September 12-17, 2020. The training will be conducted by U.S. Marine Corps – Chemical Biological Incident Response Force (CBIRF). State, local, and city organizations will be potential participants.

Jennifer Rominger, IL DoIT, provided an update on the FFY 2018 cyber security project. Discussion followed. It was determined that a Cyber Security Working Group would be established in concert with the Critical Infrastructure Committee. The purpose of the working group is to develop the cyber security strategy for the state of Illinois in addition to identifying areas of concern and recommending/prioritizing projects to be funded to accomplish the goals established by the working group.
