#### **Minutes**

#### Call to Order

IEMA-OHS PGA Section Manager Bob Evans welcomed everyone attending in Springfield and in Joliet.

## > Recognition

Deputy Homeland Security Advisor/IL-HSAC Chair Pro Tempore Claire Moravec recognized and congratulated Homeland Security Advisor/IL-HSAC Chair/IEMA-OHS Director Alica Tate-Nadeau on her upcoming retirement at the end of March. She thanked Tate-Nadeau for her contributions to the state over the past six years+, which will have lasting impacts – particularly her work to enhance Illinois' preparedness, prevention, resilience, and response capabilities.

# State Homeland Security Updates

- HSA/IEMA-OHS Director Tate-Nadeau expressed her appreciation for working with the HSAC on critical legislation and initiatives, encouraged the HSAC to remain proactive in addressing emerging threats and providing counsel to the next HSA, and emphasized the importance of mutual aid across the state.
- Deputy HSA/IL-HSAC Chair Pro Tempore and IEMA-OHS Deputy Director of Homeland Security Claire Moravec addressed the existing federal funding freeze, explaining that the State of Illinois is currently litigating the matter in federal court. She advised HSAC organizations to consult their legal counsels regarding how to move forward – or not move forward – on their current projects and noted that any additional updates she is able to share will be promptly communicated.

Considering the ongoing uncertainty surrounding federal funding allocations and reimbursements, Moravec emphasized the importance of continuing to be strategic and disciplined in utilizing federal funding, focusing on projects with the greatest impact. She said initial FFY 25 grant project proposals will be evaluated based on necessity, feasibility, and alignment with homeland security priorities, ensuring projects have clear, measurable outcomes with sustainable long-term benefits statewide.

## > New Business

- Open Meeting Act IEMA-OHS Staff Attorney and OMA Officer Jon England discussed the OMA Act in relation to allowing remote attendance at HSAC meetings. If the council chooses to allow remote attendance, a change to the HSAC Bylaws will be required, after which time the Act allows for remote attendance under specific circumstances as long as there is a quorum physically present at the primary meeting location(s). Moravec advised that with the current HSA retiring soon, no changes will be made to the bylaws until a replacement is named. England clarified that committees are currently allowed to set up remote meeting locations that meet all OMA criteria (open to the public, notice publicly posted, etc.).
- Budget Timeline Update Evans shared that the president has signed the federal budget, which includes a total HSGP funding amount that is the same as last year. The usual course of events after the budget is signed involves FEMA scheduling webinars with the states to discuss national priorities, state allocations/splits, etc. To date, no information has been shared by FEMA. Evans said he will push out information as it's received.

The current budget timeline includes switching the May HSAC meetings – May 7 will be a Council of Chairs meeting, and May 28th will be a full meeting. Evans went over the tentative timeline, which is

based on the Notice of Funding Opportunity being released sometime in April. (Timeline is attached to these minutes.) Moravec reminded chairs that federal funding is currently frozen; however, the HSAC is continuing to move forward with the grants timeline as usual so Illinois will be positioned to act on key initiatives when funding becomes available.

- Review of Federal FY25 SHSP/USAI Budget Proposal Recommendations Evans said that all initial project proposals were received and entered into a spreadsheet, which he displayed for the group. Initial requests totaled \$3.3 million more than last year's allocation, which is this year's anticipated allocation. Staff will work with funding recipients individually to ascertain if some items could move to the PAR grant, what projects are sustainment vs. new, if some projects are scalable, etc. Moravec also asked organizations to keep in mind existing open awards that could be utilized for proposed projects. Evans mentioned that any national priorities that are announced could affect how much funding is available for other projects. Moravec said that once the final numbers are agreed upon, the HSAC will present its proposal to the HSA, who will determine final allocations.
- Development of the State FY26 PAR Budget Recommendation Evans advised committees to start looking at projects for the SFY 26 Preparedness and Response Grant Program, which starts July 1, 2025. The request for the PAR program in this year's state budget is \$10 million. Evans said he will be sending out a request for PAR program proposals, similar in format to the request for unmet needs proposals.
- Current PAR program All funds for SFY25 are currently allocated to grantees. IEMA-OHS retained a share of the funding for some communications items. Roughly three months are left in the performance period: all items must be delivered and reimbursed by July 31, 2025. He urged grantees to notify him or Nichole Strayer immediately if they need to revise their budgets, as it's extremely important to ensure all funds are expended.

**September**-IEMA-OHS receives FFY 25 Award. Grant agreements issued to all organizations who have approved Final Attachment A's. FEMA may place a hold on certain projects or ask IEMA-OHS to revise submission of IJ's based upon what projects are approved and how it affects funding splits.
