# **Minutes**

## > Call to Order

IEMA-OHS Preparedness and Grants Administration Division Chief Bob Evans welcomed everyone attending in Springfield and in Joliet. He introduced IEMA-OHS Acting Director Ted Berger, who started on May 15<sup>th</sup>.

# > Public Comments

None.

## State Homeland Security Updates

- IEMA-OHS Acting Director Berger spoke briefly on his background and history with the IL-HSAC (and former ITTF), pointing out that Illinois was one of the first states to build a mechanism, i.e., the ITTF, to bring stakeholders together to make decisions regarding the emerging homeland security industry. He acknowledged the current uncertainty surrounding federal funding, noting that the HSAC framework of partnerships will continue to guide future collaboration.
- Illinois State Police Director Brendan Kelly also spoke to the current circumstances, saying that in an
  environment of ever-decreasing federal funding, now is the time for the HSAC to find alternative
  ways to sustain the critical missions that ensure the safety of Illinois residents. Given the level of
  institutional knowledge represented on the IL-HSAC, he said he is optimistic that everyone working
  together can solve any challenges the state encounters.

#### > Old Business

Update on Unmet Needs List Projects – FFY21 HSGP (expires 8/31/25), SFY25 PAR (expires 6/30/25)

Evans reported that as funds from these expiring grant programs have been returned, the HSAC has been able to fund all of the highest priority projects for which there is still adequate time to complete, including drones for ISP SWAT and several ILEAS items. As of the meeting date, no unallocated funds are currently available. Evans thanked everyone for their organizations' efforts to ensure all funds are spent.

#### > New Business

- Budget Timeline Updates
  - FFY25 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Notice of Funding Opportunity has not been released. It is assumed that the funding amount will be the same as FFY24. Evans reported that the total of initial SHSP project submissions was \$4.8 million over the predicted allocation; now, with revisions, it is down to \$672 under budget (see attachment). Evans said the turnaround time to submit applications could be very brief this year.
  - o SFY26 Preparedness and Response (PAR) Grant Program project submissions the SFY 26 request is for \$10 million; by the next Council of Chairs meeting, the final allocation will be known.

Committee chairs/representatives provided brief descriptions of their proposed PAR projects (see attachment).

Evans explained that once the final PAR amount in the budget implementation bill is released, revisions will be made to the requested amounts to bring the total in line with the allocation. He pointed out that some items are scalable and can be adjusted accordingly on the PAR list. In addition, items removed from the PAR project list can potentially be moved to the Unmet Needs list, where historically there is a good chance they will be funded.

 HSGP extensions – IEMA-OHS will look to extend FFY23 HSGP to 8/31/27 and FFY24 HSGP to 8/31/28. Evans will keep the Council of Chairs updated on these requests to FEMA.

- Closing remarks Acting Director Berger explained that as he transitions into his new role and as signature authority issues are being determined, there will be a 1-2 week pause on some signature matters relative to the role of IEMA-OHS as the State Administrative Agency. He asked that he be kept apprised of the execution deadlines of items pending approval to ensure timely action.

Berger thanked everyone for their flexibility during these uncertain times regarding federal grant opportunities and stressed that because the group is made up of dynamic leaders who are industry professionals, he is confident challenges will be met head on together.
